Halloween Costume Guidelines

Students are welcome to dress up for Halloween on Tuesday, October 31. However, students must be sure to follow school rules regarding this activity:

The administration always reserves the right to deem the appropriateness of all costumes and may ask you to change.

Halloween is NOT a free dress day. It is a regular school day. All dress code rules still apply. Students wearing disruptive or offensive costumes will be asked to change immediately.

- Masks are allowed, but must be removed for class.
 Staff members must be able to identify students.
- 2. Costumes that are provocative, revealing, sexual in nature, or employ questionable props are not permitted.
- 3. Costumes that depict violence, alcohol, or drugs are not permitted.
- 4. Realistic looking weapons are not permitted.
- 5. Costumes should not hinder your ability to participate in your classes, including P.E. Costumes may not disrupt or impede traffic, or present issues of safety in the hallway.
- 6. You are either in a full costume or in your RA uniform. This means you are not allowed to wear jeans or shorts and and a t-shirt, etc. If you don't know what a full costume is, it is best for you to wear your RA uniform.
- 7. Shoes no slip ons.
- 8. no bare midriffs or "revealing" clothing, appropriate shoes must be worn, etc.
- 9. Hat/Hoods can be worn as long as they are part of a specific costume and can be removed in class.
- Hoodies are not allowed.
- 11. Swimming suits and underwear are not to be worn as a costume, even over clothes.
- 12. Shorts/skirts must be school appropriate in length and fit.
- 13. Ripped jeans may be worn only if they are a part of an overall costume. For example, scarecrow, hobo, zombie.
